Classroom Obstacle Course:

Create an obstacle course in the classroom. Scatter some paper paw prints around the room. Have the students follow the path as they try to keep away from the bear. Pretend you are travelling the same path as in the book. Make the appropriate sounds! This activity is great for gross motor skills and recall.
