Art:

Toilet Paper Tube Elephant



An adult should cut out the elephant pieces from one toilet paper tube. Then your child paints the pieces gray and, once they are dry, glues them on the elephant's body. Last, your child adds details to the elephant with a black marker.

Note: If you don't have paint, your child can use crayons or markers.

Welcome Rocks



Find a large rock with a flat surface. Wash and dry it. Using paint and/or markers, have your child decorate it. You can write the word *Welcome* in pencil, and your child can trace over it with the markers.

Stick Clubhouse



Go exploring outside with your child to find sticks, moss, and leaves. Use your treasures to cover and then glue them on a small milk carton.
