### Dragon, Dragon, Spicy Taco

Play this game just like Duck, Duck, Goose!

#### **Hold Your Tail**

To play this game, each player will need a dragon's tail. For this, you can tie a ribbon around each child's waist and then tuck a sock or long piece of material into the ribbon. Set a timer and have them run around the play area. The object is for each player to grab as many tails as possible while at the same time protecting their own. If a tail is taken, it may be replaced with one taken from another player. When time is up, any players without a tail are out. The remaining players will count their tails and the one with the most is crowned the dragon king or queen.
