

## Hear-and-Say Reading Teacher Guide

Remember! Great hear and say reading sessions always include:

- ✓ Introducing the title and author of the book. Point them out with your finger.
- ✓ Asking the children what they think the story will be about based on the title and cover.
- ✓ Using each type of prompting question when planning your story times.
- ✓ Following up your questions by acknowledging the children's responses, expanding on their ideas, and repeating key information.



**Book Title:** Augustus and His Smile by Catherine Rayner

**The first page of this book begins with:** Augustus the tiger was sad.

**Helpful tip:** For easy reference, use the prompt questions on the labels or photocopy them and attach them on the appropriate pages in the book.

Cover: What do you see on the cover?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, O</i>	Cover: What color is the butterfly on Augustus' nose? Have you seen a butterfly before?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, D</i>	Cover: What happens to Augustus in this book?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, R</i>
P1: Have you lost something before? How did you feel?  <i>Prompt Type: D</i>	P1: What do you think happened to Augustus' smile?  <i>Prompt Type: R, O</i>	P3: Let's do a huge tigery stretch together. Why do you think tigers like to stretch?  <i>Prompt Type: D, O</i>
P4: What do you see in this picture?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, O</i>	P4: Augustus finds a shiny beetle. What's something else that's shiny?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, O</i>	P5: Does Augustus find his smile here?  <i>Prompt Type: R</i>
P6: Have you climbed a tree before? How big was it?  <i>Prompt Type: D</i>	P6: Can we find all the birds in this picture? How many birds are there? Are they hard to find? (camouflage)  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, O</i>	P8-9: Where is Augustus now?  <i>Prompt Type: W</i>
P9: What time of day is it? How can you tell?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh</i>	P9: Have you seen snow before? What did you do in the snow?  <i>Prompt Type: D</i>	P15: Right now in the story it's really hot and dry... what is the weather going to be like on the next page?  <i>Prompt Type: R</i>

P17: What do you think he saw?  <i>Prompt Type: O</i>	P13: What does it mean for a place to be a desert?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh</i>	P17: Do you like to splash in puddles?  <i>Prompt Type: D</i>
P19: Have you ever seen your reflection? Where?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, O, D</i>	P19: How is Augustus feeling now? How can you tell?  <i>Prompt Type: O</i>	P21: What are the things that made Augustus happy?  <i>Prompt Type: R, O</i>
P21: What makes you happy?  <i>Prompt Type: D</i>	P23: Where do you think he went?  <i>Prompt Type: O</i>	P23: Do you notice what Augustus left behind as he jumped away? (paw prints) Where do you think those came from?  <i>Prompt Type: Wh, O</i>

### Extension Activities:

- Tiger handprint art: Use paint to make a tiger handprint. Students draw a place around it that makes them feel happy (like the tall mountain, ocean with fish, etc).
- Decorated mirrors: Students create mirrors (using mirror paper) decorated with things that will make them smile when they look at themselves.
